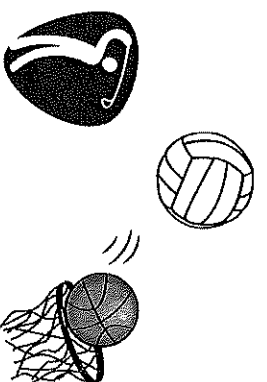

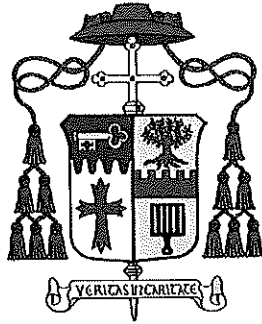

Dear Families, Faculty, Staff, Administrators, School pastors and Board members,

Over the past several days, the Catholic Schools Office and school administrators have heard from people who oppose the mandate issued by the Pennsylvania Department of Health requiring all students and staff in Pre-K-12 schools to wear masks. As you are aware, we issued a statement on August 20 listing several recommendations for schools entering the 2021-22 academic year. Among them: "All schools will be required to follow mandates that may be issued from government agencies, including masking."

I stand firmly behind this decision. We are doing this for the health and welfare of our students, faculty, staff and administrators, and our lawyers have confirmed the mandate is a legally binding order.

I am aware of the strong opinions for and against mask wearing. I cannot convince people one way or another in a letter. But after much study and a proven track record from last year, we believe the best option for continuing in-person education — a priority educators strongly support — is to follow the guidance of the CDC and the order issued by the Pennsylvania Department of Health.

Although many have expressed gratitude for our decision and have supported their local administrators, I am disappointed in the level of vitriol being used by some who do not support it. Every family in our schools is important to us, so I am sorry people are threatening to walk away from the opportunities and value of a Catholic education over the approach we are taking to ensure health and safety.

Generations of families, teachers and administrators have made Catholic education possible in the Diocese of Erie. That legacy continues today because of the hard work and commitment of administrators, faculty and staff as well as the sacrifice of parents. Their efforts during the pandemic have been that much more impressive. Even though it could put that legacy at risk for some of our schools, we cannot let enrollment issues drive the decision to follow the mask mandate. Please remember this is a temporary situation and that our recommendations provide enough leeway for schools to make decisions once the government mandates are lifted.

P.S. On the question of exemptions: It is not possible to use a religious exemption regarding masks, as they are not against the teachings of the Catholic faith. Students with documented medical conditions from a licensed medical professional will need to work directly with school administrators to explore what accommodations can and cannot be made in their school for this purpose.

RE: COVID-19 Update

This correspondence is to inform you of the following:

- On Tuesday, August 31, 2021, a mask mandate for K-12 schools, public and private, was issued.
 - The Pennsylvania Department of Health order will take effect Tuesday, September 7, 2021.

- Regardless of vaccination status, all students, teachers, and staff will be required to wear a mask indoors at both St. Stephen School and Venango Catholic Jr/Sr High School.
- The order will not apply to student-athletes while in active play. Players will be required to mask on the bench and sidelines.
- All parents and visitors to our schools are required per the August 31 mandate to wear a mask while on a school campus this includes sporting events.
- Please remember VRCS is required to follow all masking orders mandated by federal, state, or local government.
- VRCS is required to contact trace positive COVID-19 cases, notify close contacts, and require individuals to quarantine from school.
- Staff, parents, and students should know the signs and symptoms of COVID-19.
 - People with COVID-19 have reported a wide range of symptoms (including no symptoms) ranging from mild to severe illness. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus. The symptoms include:
 - Fever or chills
 - Cough
 - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
 - Fatigue
 - Muscle or body aches
 - Headache
 - New loss of taste or smell
 - Sore throat
 - Congestion or runny nose
 - Nausea or vomiting
 - Diarrhea

- Symptoms such as fever, sore throat, cough, diarrhea, nausea or vomiting, severe headache may be caused by an illness that can spread to others. Anyone with these symptoms should:
 - Stay home
 - Get tested for COVID-19 (PCR Test)
- If the test is negative, stay home until symptoms have been gone for 24 hours without the use of medication.
- If the test is positive, you must isolate for ten days from symptom onset or a positive test.
- If someone is showing any of these signs, seek emergency medical care immediately:
 - Trouble breathing
 - Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
 - New confusion
 - Inability to wake or stay awake
 - Pale, gray, or blue-colored skin, lips, or nail beds, depending on skin tone
- Students, staff, and visitors who are exhibiting COVID-19 signs and symptoms will be immediately sent home.
- If spread requires a school closure, all education will immediately transition to online learning.
- VRCS will not ask students, staff, visitors, or parents to prove vaccination status but will ask vaccination status to conduct contact tracing accurately. VRCS strongly encourages all individuals eligible to get the vaccine to consider vaccination.
- All COVID-19 information for VRCS is available on our website, venangocatholic.org, under the Return to School tab.
- VRCS will continue to work with state and local health officials to monitor community transmission and the spread of COVID-19 and reserves the right to modify mitigation efforts and guidelines.

Because of its highly contagious and sometimes "hidden" nature, it is currently very difficult to control the spread of COVID- 19 or to determine whether, where, or how a specific individual may have been exposed to the disease.</p> <p>I acknowledge the contagious nature of COVID-19, the fact that it can be difficult to identify in another person, and the inherent risks of exposure to those who may be infected with COVID-19. I voluntarily assume the risk that I/my child/my household members may be exposed to or infected by COVID-19 as a result of or in connection with my child's attendance at school and that such exposure or infection may result in personal injury, illness, permanent disability, and/or even death.</p> <p>I acknowledge that the CDC and many other public health authorities continue to recommend vaccination for eligible persons, face covering, social distancing and other protective measures to prevent the spread of COVID-19, which may be updated at any time. INDEMNIFY AND DEFEND.

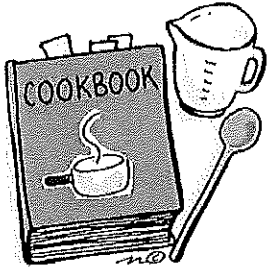

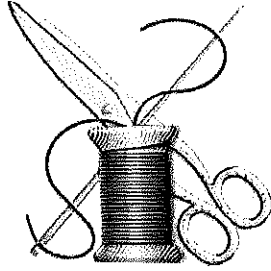

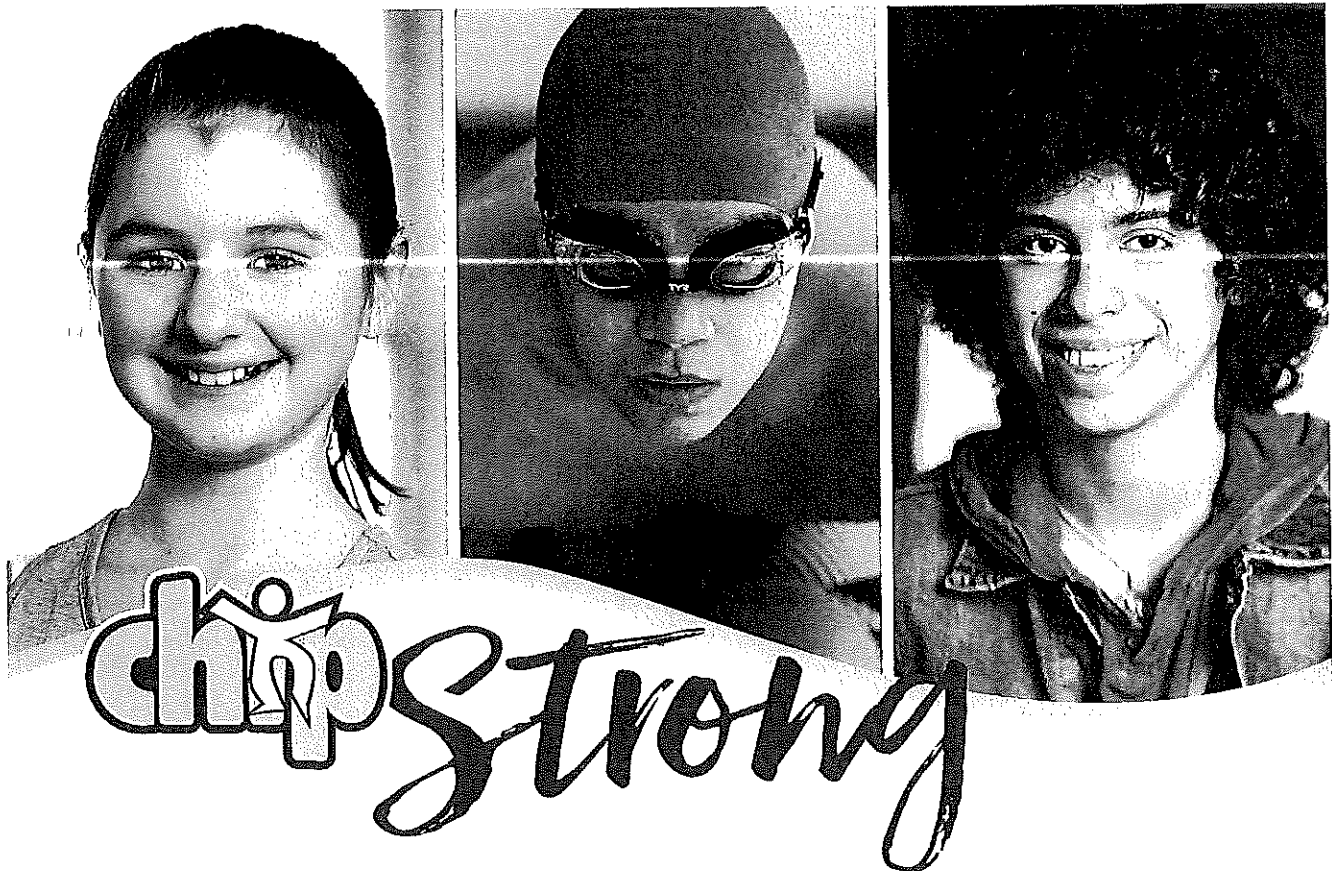
