WHAT CAN CATHOLIC EDUCATION OFFER TO YOUTH?

Richard Sabousky, Ph.D. (VCHS Class of '79) graduated with a class of 75 members. Born and raised in Oil City, he was selected as our first distinguished alumni spotlight because of his significant contributions to special and regular education.

He has served the community on a variety of boards and committees, including the VRCS Board, VTDC, Pennsylvania Chapter of the Council for Exceptional Children, and The International Dyslexia Association (PA Chapter). Dr. Sabousky aided in the development of Structured Literacy Guidelines for teacher preparation programs in our commonwealth.

library windows."


The class also enjoyed a reunion dinner and conversation at Bella Cucina in Franklin.
