The following letter was first distributed via email to all current Venango Region Catholic School families this past month.

October 23, 2023

Dear VRCS Stakeholders,

The purpose of this letter is to provide a quick status report on our progress toward meeting our diocesan goals.

Diocesan Goal #1: Hire a permanent president.

The board is reviewing applications and will soon begin interviewing candidates.

Diocesan Goal #2: The goal for enrollment is to have 40 students enrolled in grades 9-12 and 20 students enrolled in grades 7-8 for the 2024-2025 school year. We currently project 36 in grades 9-12 and 22 in grades 7-8. The need to recruit more students remains, and we've had a couple of inquiries. A campaign to offer free enrollment for a 9-week trial period (new students must start by December 18) has begun. The word is being spread at parishes and by teachers and our Athletic Director.

The VRCS Enrollment and Recruitment Committee has several events planned for the months of November and December. [Additional information about these events can be found in this newsletter.] It is challenging to receive transfers in the middle of a semester, but we feel with this "Free Trial" offer at both campuses, we may gain some students who may want to make a change as we get closer to Christmas.

Diocesan Goal #3: Our cash on hand goal is to have \$600,000 by December 31, 2023 and to have an additional \$400,000 in pledges for the 2024-2025 school year. We currently sit at approximately \$300,000 on hand. The cash on hand allows us to meet our operating expenses for the 2023-2024 school year. \$120,712.35 in cash has been collected since August. This includes a \$40,000 Phillips Trust grant to be used for the playground construction at St. Stephen School.

We initiated a \$1 Million commitment campaign to develop revenue. Word is still getting out, and we will be making direct 1:1 phone appeals. We plan to hold a phone-a-thon event in November, and also we will be directly contacting vendors and past donors. If you know of people whom we should contact let us know. We have learned that our alumni lists are incomplete and although volunteers have worked hard to update them, it has been a serious challenge.

Bottom line: We are challenged to meet the enrollment goal. Revenue is coming in, but we need continued donations. As in all such campaigns, we would benefit from having some big donors. If we do not meet the three goals Venango Catholic High School (Grades 9-12) will finish out the spring semester and then close. Grades 7-8 would retract back to St. Stephen School.

We are working hard to achieve these goals! Thanks for your prayers and support!



TELL US ABOUT THE ROBOTICS PROGRAM AT VC / SSS

We have been using VEX Robotics for our high school robotic program for four years. VEX Robotics is an educational robotics platform and competition program designed to inspire and engage students in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) fields. Students meet for one class period each school day to design and build robots to compete in the current year's game.

We have carried this over to the elementary school with the recent grant award. Students in Grades 4-6 can choose Robotics as an elective. These students meet twice a week and perform the same types of tasks as a high school student would, except with snap together components.

What is the best thing about teaching at VRCS?

I am grateful for being able to teach in a Christian environment. The students and staff are exceptional.

Greg Knox is our Director of Technology and the Robotics Instructor at both St. Stephen School (SSS) and Venango Catholic Jr./Sr. High School.

For 13 years, he was systems administrator for Clarion University. He has taught at Christian Life Academy, SSS (four years), and VCHS (five years).

He and his wife Gina have three daughters - Emmi, Kai and Kiyomi.

Greg is a U.S. Air Force veteran.

SHARE A FUN FACT ABOUT YOURSELF:

I am a professional photographer and have taught photography for over sixteen years. I enjoy amateur radio and hold a general class operators license.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR EFFORTS TO GROW OUR VRCS **ROBOTICS FOOTPRINT.**

I have been successful in capturing grant money to grow our robotics program at both VC and St. Stephen. In the fall of '22, we received a grant to develop a STEAM lab (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) and received \$12,700 to buy new laptops and two 3D printers. More recently, I applied for two grants to the Catholic Foundation of Northwest Pennsylvania. In September 2023, we were able to purchase VEX IQ robots for St. Stephen students, as well as six robots for field and games. These work with six teams of three students, serving 18 students. Pending is a \$14,000 grant application for 65-inch flat-screen interactive smartboards and laptops for teachers in Grades 1 through 6. We will know if we receive that grant later this year.

WHAT MIGHT ROBOTICS LOOK LIKE IN FIVE YEARS?

School robotics kits and platforms may become more advanced and sophisticated, allowing students to work on more complex projects. These kits might include advanced sensors, AI capabilities, and improved programming environments. Schools may start using virtual and augmented reality technologies to enhance the robotics learning experience. This could allow students to design and interact with robots in virtual environments.

WHAT DO YOU DO FOR FUN?

I really enjoy directing and performing in community theater in the Pittsburgh area. I also like to read, see live performances, try out new restaurants, and hang out in the outdoors with my husband and our dog.



SHARE A SUCCESS STORY:

I had such a blast directing the seventh grade play, "The Mysterious Case of the Missing Ring," at St. Stephen School a few years ago. (It brought back very fond memories from seventh grade, when I got to play Princess Aurora in Sleeping Beauty!) The kids did such a great job, and I loved having the chance to bring a little live theatre to the community where I grew up.

ANY ADVICE FOR TODAY'S VRCS STUDENTS?

Try something new — join a club, sign up for an activity, put yourself out there. This is the time to start exploring who you are and who you want to be, so take advantage of those opportunities. (It's also good for your resume!)

FAVORITE TEACHER?

I don't think I can pick a favorite! But what I can say is this: I am much more of an arts person than a science or math person. It made me feel really cared for, and it gave me the confidence to try hard things. The love and dedication it takes to do that is really special — and I think all of the teachers at VC embodied that way of living and working.


