My best memory was having the girls win the District IX Basketball Championship at Clarion University. Of course, surviving teaching high school for most of my career. I was truly blessed to see so many students grow into amazing people.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: The last 23 years of my teaching career were spent at VCHS. I taught Social Studies, which included U.S. History, World History, Psychology, Government, and Criminal Justice. I also served as the Athletic Director and Girls Basketball coach.

BLESSINGS FROM YOUR TIME TEACHING AT VCHS:

Venango Catholic was where Jesus wanted me to be for a lot of reasons. One of those was so Mary Ellen and I could foster our daughter **Mary**. She is happily married and has one son, **Bowen**. Another blessing was going on several senior retreats and telling our God journey to a lot of now graduates. IN MEMORY OF MSGR. JOSEPH BOBAL

The **Reverend Monsignor Joseph Bobal** recently passed away at age 88, at Christ the King Manor.

Msgr. Bobal was ordained by Bishop McManaman at St. Peter Cathedral in 1963, and his first assignment was as a member of the VCHS faculty, teaching Physics and Earth & Space Science. Concurrently, he served as weekend assistant at the Assumption Parish in Oil City and St. Venantius Parish in Rouseville.

Fr. Bobal taught under Father (later Msgr.)
Lawrence J. Antoun, founding Headmaster,
until 1976, when he assumed a pastoral
assignment at St. Anthony Parish in Walston.
Fr. Bobal went on to shepherd several rural
Catholic churches in Osceola Mills, Houtzdale,
Ridgway, Grampian and Curwensville. In
1994, he was appointed a Chaplain to His
Holiness with the title of Monsignor. Msgr.
Bobal was a beloved founding faculty
member at VCHS, and he will be missed.

LIFE LESSONS OF ALL KINDS WERE DR. RUBY'S CALLING CARDS AT VC

James Ruby, a longtime teacher and later headmaster at Venango Christian High School whose tenure spanned almost all of the school's first quarter century, was certainly one of a kind.

His style in the classroom, which combined vast amounts of knowledge with healthy doses of humor but also a strong touch of intimidation if a student wasn't prepared or interested, left its mark on all those students who felt lucky enough to attend VC "back in those days."

Those fond memories have come flooding back to alums from the mid 1960s all the way through the late 1980s with the sad news that Dr. Ruby, as almost all his students still called him decades later, passed away Dec. 9 at the age of 85.

I am one of those VC grads (1975) Dr. Ruby influenced both in and out of the classroom. We often reminisced fondly about the VC days when we saw each other, particularly the time when he asked me in very stern terms why I wasn't giving it my all in advanced history.

Venango Christian opened in September 1962, and Dr. Ruby came on board as a teacher in 1965. He was named headmaster in January 1973 and remained at the school in both capacities until 1989.

Dr. Ruby was a towering figure in local education circles during and well after his time at Venango Christian. His family summed up his numerous academic accomplishments quite well in his obituary, including the many innovations he helped spearhead at VC that changed traditional learning models in the 1960s and 1970s and brought the school some nationwide prominence.

The VC Saga yearbook for 1972 (my freshman year) listed Dr. Ruby's titles as administrative assistant-curriculum and discipline, humanities department head and social studies head.

He wore many hats and could teach many things, but the word that should have been in capital letters in that job description is discipline. That was certainly a Dr. Ruby strong suit as many grads will attest.

We all looked forward to our big CC Week (Comparative Cultures) projects every year, and Dr. Ruby's weekly DFPNQs (Derrick Front Page News Quiz) kept us abreast of current events of the day.

And we watched things such as Princess Anne's wedding in 1973 and the classic movie "Giant" from the 1950s in the classroom. We all

thought we had the best of everything at VC, and Dr. Ruby was front and center for much of it.

He'd pop up at all the sports events, choral performances and class fundraisers outside of school as well.

His passing sent me looking to my VC yearbooks, where I found the pictures that accompany this story.

They capture his personality and sense of humor and remind so many of us what made our VC days memorable [...]

Janet Parker, my alphabetical classroom and locker neighbor all through grade school and high school [...] shared this story.

"In high school, I skipped one class. One class one time. Of course I got caught by him. It was the last week of our senior year. He handed me the book, 'Inside the Third Reich', which was perhaps over 1,000 pages, and told me I would not graduate unless I read the entire book and reported the contents back to him in an individual conference. I did it."

Deb Duda Gale, a 1973 VC grad who now lives in England and has become a long-distance Facebook friend, also shared some of her memories, and four words she used jumped out — legend, scary, fun, taskmaster. They all applied.

Dr. Ruby sent many correspondences to me at the paper over the years with suggestions and story ideas and also critiques of what we were doing.

He never signed those letters, which continued up until the last year or so, but there was no doubt who they were from [...]

He was a mentor and friend to be treasured.

Grades 3-6 traveled to the Barrow-Civic Theater to see "Fairy Tale Christmas" on Monday, November 20.


The students were very excited to support one of our SSS fifth-graders who participated in the production!
