TELL US ABOUT YOUR CAREER PATH:

Halfway through a Masters in Counseling at Edinboro, I was hired by the Venango-Clarion Mental Health Center as the first full time D&A therapist. While working at the Venango-Clarion Mental Health Center I had the good fortune to participate in an internship program thru the Philadelphia Child Guidance Center. I was mentored by doctors **Haley** and **Minuchin**, who we leaders in the field of structural family therapy. In 1979, I was hired by Venango County as the County Mental Health/Mental Retardation and Drug and Alcohol Administrator. In 1985, I went to work for St. Vincent's Hospital where I was charged with setting up detox programs in NW Pennsylvania. After one year, I returned to Venango County as the County Human Services Director and held that position until 2004. During that period I completed my Masters Degree. I was hired as the CEO for the Mercer County Behavioral Health Agency in 2004; Mercer basically privatized their county human services in the non-profit agency.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Mr. George Cavanaugh is being featured as a distinguished graduate from the VCHS Class of 1968. After graduating from Venango Christian, George began his career working full time at Warren State Hospital while completing his bachelor degree.

During his tenure in human services, George was active in a number of local, state, and national organizations. In 1988, he was the president of the PA Human Services Directors Association, and then in 1999 he became president of the PA Mental Health-Mental Retardation Administrators Association. He also served on the National Board of Behavioral Health Directors. Locally he served two terms on the Rouseville Borough Council and one term as Rouseville mayor. He was very active in Saint Venantius Church, serving as financial moderator for many decades. George currently serves as a board member or officer on a number of local non-profit agencies.


