Thank you to faculty member **Jessie Pyle** and the VC staff for making this trip happen.




#### **KOMATSU KIDZ!**

## **ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT**

#### **DISTINGUISHED ALUMNA**

NAME: Susan Boyer Drelick (VC '70)

**TELL US ABOUT YOUR CAREER:** I am a recently retired licensed psychologist. I worked in various capacities in the Mental Health field since 1974. I began in county mental health, initially here and later in Philadelphia. I was employed in an inpatient psychiatric hospital for a number of years as part of a multidisciplinary treatment team. From 1995 until my retirement in 2022 I was initially an employee and subsequently a partner and co-owner in a group private practice which included psychological, psychiatric, and social work components (Rural Mental Health Associates). I was blessed to have been able to participate in a Family Therapy program under the supervision of the Philadelphia Child Guidance Center which allowed me to broaden my area of expertise to better serve the families of Venango County.

**EDUCATION**: I began my college years at St. Mary's College in Notre Dame, IN. In 1972 the University of Notre Dame for the first time became coeducational and I was in the first class of women admitted, graduating in 1974 with a B.A. in Psychology with Highest Honors. I worked in the mental health field for ten years before returning to graduate school. While working full time, I attended Slippery Rock University at night while my husband (fellow VCHS 1970 classmate **Rick Drelick**) took care of our two daughters, then 2 and 4. I completed my M.A. in Psychology in 1986 and passed the licensure exam in Psychology in 1991.

**DO YOU HAVE A FAVORITE VC CLASS/TEACHER?** When I attended VC, it was still a relatively new venture in education. We were exploring new educational concepts and were observed by educators from all over the United States. It made for an environment that was intellectually stimulating and challenging. It is very difficult to single out 'favorite' teachers as each excelled in their own areas. I must say that the Advanced History class taught by **Dr. Jim Ruby** was far and away one of the most satisfying accomplishments in my high school career. It was difficult and there were no excuses for other activities conflicting with assignments. I remember a group of us carrying encyclopedias with us on a bus trip to an away game! Another highlight from my high school years was being exposed to the early days of the brilliant model/mentor **Sister Joan Chittester (Sr. Mary Peter)**, who went on to be a theological/feminist role model for women in our church.

#### WHAT DO YOU DO FOR FUN/RECREATION?

For me, my love of music/singing came to fruition at VC under the direction of **Sr. Mary David Callahan**. It has been my fun/recreation in many capacities over the course of my whole life. My piano foundation from **Sr. Antoinette Harrison** underlies all of my endeavors, but it was the addition of vocal music in high school that gave me the confidence to stand up and present myself in front of an audience without giving in to undue fear. My involvement with choirs, musicals, and theatre all are grounded in my high school years.

I would be remiss at this stage of my life, however, not to acknowledge that my greatest 'fun' is spending time with my seven grandchildren!

#### WHAT IMPACT DID VCHS LEAVE ON

YOU? I am so very grateful for spending my formative years at VC. It was a tumultuous time in our world- racial riots, the assassinations of Bobby Kennedy and Martin Luther King, the Vietnam War, the beginning stirrings of feminism, and the radical changes in our church after Vatican II... I believe that my ability to rise to challenges, to assert myself, to be willing to become a role model all are rooted in the fundamental expectation instilled in us at VC that we are to be kind, to care for others, to go the extra mile. And moreto pick ourselves up and start over when we fall.

#### DO YOU HAVE A FUNNY VC MEMORY?

I find it odd that I cannot single out an individual 'funny memory'. Must be because so much of our days were spent on serious study (ha!) - but I do remember an awful lot of laughing!!!

#### ANY ADVICE FOR VRCS STUDENTS?

In looking back after all these years, perhaps the best advice I can offer VC students today is to take what VCHS has instilled in you and go forward to whatever next adventure life offers you. The impending closing of VC is only the first of many challenges and disappointments you will face in your lives. Be present. Be confident. BE KIND. And know... you are not alone.




